Board Meeting Report Special Programs Report 3/22/22 From Aaron Ball, Director of Special Programs

- 38 Current Special Programs Students Eligibility Criteria includes Autism, Intellectual Disability, Speech Impairment, Other Health Impairment: ADHD, Emotional Disturbance (ED), Specific Learning Disabilities, Tourette Syndrome
- **3** Under evaluation now with an additional **3** waiting on consent from parents
- 23 504 students. These students receive accommodations in the classroom and/or dyslexia services

1 student 1:1 all day. He has an aide or teacher with him at all times throughout the day

2 students receive 1:1 behavior support for 3 hours or more

- **2** Dedicated Full-time Special Programs Aides
- 2 Part time Aides
- 2 Full-time Special Education Teachers (behavior support teacher position open)

E-therapy for social skills groups started last month. Few hiccups but students needing social skills per their IEP are now receiving that time.

Supporting documentation for corrections is almost finished. 2 more ARDs will need to be held to correct.. CAP monitoring has started. 1st phase (timelines for evals and initials) continues. Review meeting to be held at the end of the month.

Board Meeting Report Marketing and Recruiting Report March 29, 2022 From Kristi Lee

Marketing:

On Saturday, March 12, we mailed 1600 postcards to the Teravista neighborhoods. I'm bringing a copy of the cards for the board members. We have an additional ~1000 postcards to use in a future mailout.

The Poppy Festival is April 22-24, and we sent in the form and chose a booth near the children's activities. We will be listed as a sponsor with additional advertising included, and be in the parade. Caroline Clark will be heading up the booth coverage.

The Austin Alta Apartments are open and leasing homes. We've contacted them and plan to take a "Welcome to Neighborhood" plant and card on March 25. We will ask them to add us to their website under the 'schools near us' tab and advertise on their property with posters or flyers. We may add them to our website as a sponsor company.

Marketing and recruiting for new hires:

With about 40 school days left, we are not hiring anyone else for this school year. We have two good assistant candidates that we are utilizing as substitute teachers and may offer positions for 2022-2023.

Recently we hired a special education support contractor to provide minutes to students as required.



Goodwater Montessori Board Report - 3/21/22 <u>Covid Report</u> Alma Lahmon School Programs Coordinator

Goodwater Montessori has had 0 reported active Covid19 cases for four consecutive weeks. Our cumulative totals for the school year so far is 77. Goodwater continues to institute universal precautions to mitigate the spread of Covid19 or other contagious viruses or diseases. This includes optional mask wearing for students and staff and enhanced hygiene practices. Symptom assessments and monitoring continue to mitigate the spread of this virus and other diseases.

Williamson County transmission level is listed as Low.

- People may choose to mask at any time.
- People with symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19 should wear a mask.
- Individuals who are autoimmune compromised or compromised due to other medical issues, should consult with their medical provider to minimize exposure.



Instruction and Curriculum Report Submitted by Sandy Worcester 03/22/2022

- STAAR Reading After-school tutoring program had an average attendance of 6 students in attendance each session.
- STAAR Math Saturday school had an average attendance of 6 students in attendance each session.
- RTI for Tier 2 and Tier 3 students in Reading (BookNook) and Math (Zearn) has begun in the classrooms. Guides are providing small group instruction with these TEA High Impact Tutoring programs.
- TELPAS: In process: Katy Ford-Metzler, Roberta Givens, Liliana Pinzon, Sharon Garcia, and Melvin Blackburn are assessing K/1 students' holistic rating, and 2-8th grade written composition samples.
- STAAR Benchmark Interim assessment for grades 3-8 took place March 1-4th. We will present results data during the upcoming Board Meeting.
- Dyslexia training is scheduled for all Guides. (Jeannette Ridgeway, staff Dyslexia Specialist) will provide training during Team Meetings over 2 30 minute sessions). This training is TEA mandated but will provide Guides with strategies to address dyslexia interventions in the classroom.
- Child Study: The Child Study committee addressed 30 students on the schedule since September; 7 students were referred for next steps (evaluation, 504), 10 students are on the schedule for March and April.

b. Dr. Bruce Tabor presented the Superintendent Report. This includes a recap of the professional development day with staff, an update on safety drills, information about the

prospective parent sessions, and a Covid-19 update. He mentioned a meeting with the Williamson County EOM to discuss this week's possible inclement weather.

Dr. Bruce Taobr reviewed tutoring outside of school hours with Jackie Templeton and Jordan Young. Our annual fundraiser is going well with donations of \$11,000 at this point. He updated the board about learning happening in the orchard and thanked the people involved in thiese projects.

Goodwater Montessori Charter School Library Challenge Policy From: Jan MacWatters

Library, library volunteers and school staff should all be familiar with the challenge and the collection policy to ensure that concerns are handled appropriately.

- 1. Challenge Procedures:
- a. All concerns about library and classroom materials should be brought to the attention of the librarian/admin immediately, even if a challenge is not filed.
- b. In the event of a challenge to a book or other library/classroom item, a team of 2-4 teachers / admin will be assembled to reconsider the placement in the collection or the use of that item in the classroom.

The following procedures will be followed:

- a. The person challenging the book should complete the challenge form (attached) and state specifically why they think the book ought to be removed/restricted.
- b. The completed form will be submitted to the librarian or any administrator.
- c. Items under reconsideration will not be removed from the general collection or the classroom until the reconsideration process is complete.
- d. The challenged book will be read by the librarian and at least 2 members of the challenge committee prior to the Challenge Committee meeting.
- e. The Challenge Committee will meet within 3 weeks of the original challenge to make a decision.
- f. The content of the book will be reviewed by the challenge committee to ensure that it meets the criteria set out in the collection policy. Committee members will focus on the principles in the collection policy when making a decision.

Criteria for selecting books for the Goodwater Montessori School Libraries and classrooms.

See Collection policy (add link in final document after approval)

- a. Does it support / enhance the curriculum?
- b. Does it provide an alternative point of view to another book/item in the collection?
- c. Does it enhance/encourage free reading for all of our students?
- d. Is there an alternative book that would meet the above criteria?

Parental choice:

- a. Parents may choose to restrict a specific library book for their child without challenging the book.
- b. Parents may be given the option of an alternative book if available for classroom use.

ENROLLMENT/ATTENDANCE/2022-2023 Applications for Enrollment

- 1. Enrollment currently stands at 362. Our cumulative attendance percentage for the school year is now at 91%.
- 2. We currently have 269 applications for the 2022-2023 school year.

STUDENT RECRUITING 2022-2023

- 1. We have sent out 1,624 postcards to specific neighborhoods
- 2. We have allocated another 1,000 to specific neighborhoods
- 3. Sandy and Kristi will be visiting the new apartments on Stadium to introduce us and to welcome them to the community. They will also ask that they add us to their website as a Public Charter School near their community.
- 4. We completed our Perspective Parents meeting this past week.

COVID UPDATE

- 1. As of Monday, March 21, we have had a total of 77 COVID cases for the 2021-2022 school year. We continue to see a lower number of COVID cases. We also continue with the COVID protocols that we have been following for the past two years to ensure our students, staff, and visitors are safe when they enter our building.
- 2. We have also had two cases of Influenza Flu Type A and B. We will continue to monitor flu cases during this spring. There are no new updates from the CDC or WCCHD.

ACADEMICS

- We have completed the STAAR Benchmarks for Math, Reading, Science, and Social Studies. Sandy and Roberta will provide an update on where the opportunities are for students. We will continue to provide Accelerated Instruction provided this year. We are scheduling additional tutorials during school and on Saturday.
- The Guides are working on Tier 1 RTI (Response to Intervention) for students who are now showing deficiencies based on their work for this year. These Tier 1 interventions are done in the Community by the Guides.

COFFEE WITH DR. BRUCE

COUNSELING

The school has provided counseling services to our students over the last four weeks. We continue to add students to the counseling schedule as needed. The service has been successful, and parents are beginning to get reports from the therapist on progress. The therapist has also been conducting social groups for our students with Individual Education Plans to meet the requirements of the plan.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Aaron Ball is collaborating with Sandy Worcester, and our Guides having Child Study conversations for students who might need further assistance in the community, either academically or socially. These collaborative conversations help make sure any student with difficulty receives the attention they need to be successful at school.

Aaron is also coordinating ARD meetings with parents to share the results of screening and Evaluations and annual ARD meetings. He is also working with 8th-grade students in their transition to high school.

RAISE CRAZE

I want to thank everyone for their generosity and support to our school during our Raise Craze event. The final total for this event was \$21,714.

VOLUNTEERS

I would like to recognize Michelle Wong, Celine Wulms, and Candace Garcia for their presentation about The Goodwater Montessori Garden Club. These grassroots efforts are so important to our students and support our Guides and Assistants. I look forward to working and assisting in the development of the Garden Club.

I also want to thank the board for their work in providing guidance and support to Goodwater. Parents and caregivers, it has been an interesting year 2 for education. We appreciate all of you have done and continue to do to assist in providing a positive learning environment for our students.
