The school has existed for seven years as a public charter school. The move will allow educators to focus on the needs of students at the Primary and Elementary levels, increase academic stability, solidify Montessori teaching and learning, and enhance professional development. Dr. Tabor and the leadership team at Goodwater are committed to fostering leadership and innovation in education. The board, in its commitment to transparency, encourages open dialogue with stakeholders. Dr. Bruce, Superintendent/CEO, pledges to provide regular updates on the transition plan's implementation.

Dr. Tabor has used his expertise to help Goodwater Montessori's decision-making process in his role as Superintendent/CEO since 2019. He has confidence the time will come to restore the delivery of instruction for grades 6, 7, and 8. In the meantime, he thanks the entire Goodwater community for their support. This decision reflects a commitment to the school's long-term stability. Plans are underway for the upcoming academic year, and the administration will communicate further details to all stakeholders in the coming weeks.
